# ESTS POSTGRADUATE SYMPOSIUM-MASTER CUP

SUNDAY 19 JUNE 2022 · 08:00h-12:00h

### FORMAT



The 2022 Postgraduate Course – Master Cup will be structured as a contest in which a designated expert will provide questions and cases for discussion about a specific topic.

Three teams will compete. Each will be composed of 1 captain and 6 trainees. This year due to the difficulties posed by the pandemic, participants will be chosen and assigned in strict order of request to the different teams. The course, except last minute suspension, will be held live during the congress. Therefore, participants must be able to travel to the conference venue.

#### There will be 5 identical sessions, one for each topic. Each session will be structured as follows:

- 1. The expert will give a brief introduction of the topic (2 min).
- 2. The expert will formulate six questions to all the teams at the same time and to the audience
- 3. Participants will have up to 1 minute to reply to the questions. The audience will answer to the questions from the floor using the App and benefitting from the same time allotted to the responding teams
- 4. At the end of each question: the audience voting for each question will be revealed.
- 5. Teams: For each correct answer a point will be added, for each incorrect answer half a point will be subtracted. Audience will not score negatively.
- 6 The expert will explain the correct solution according to the evidence-based data. Solutions can be provided individually for each question or globally at the end.
- 7. The expert presents a summary of the most relevant data and a final educational message (4-5 minutes)
- 8. After the five rounds of questions are finished, the final round of questions will take place. In this round each expert will ask two articulated questions based on real-case scenario related to their topic.
